Found: 9 ins. x 6 ins. x 5 ins. out of the ground granular granite type stone, well marked with three chiseled grooves on the east edge and three chiseled grooves on the south edge. Corner was 19.3 feet south of a east west fence line.

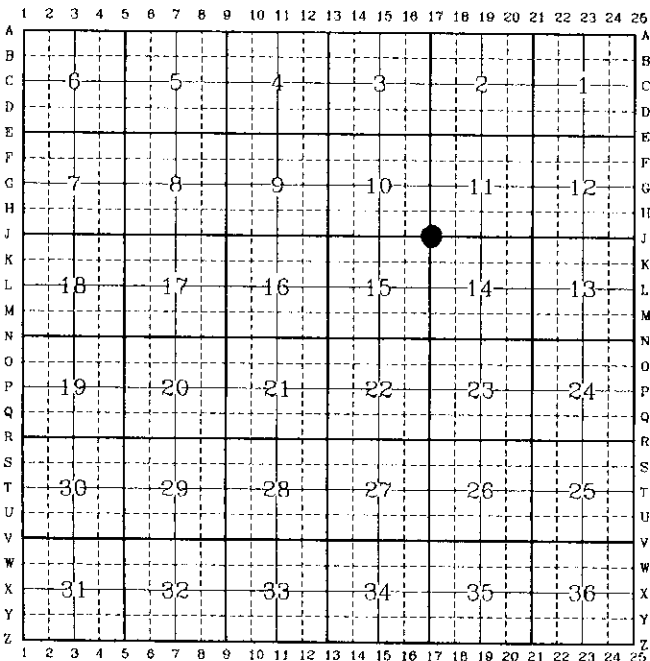
Set: Raised a small mound of stone Southwest of the corner monument.

CROSS INDEX DIAGRAM

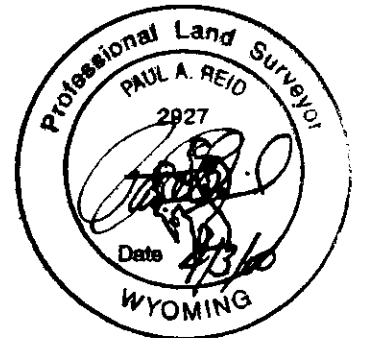
