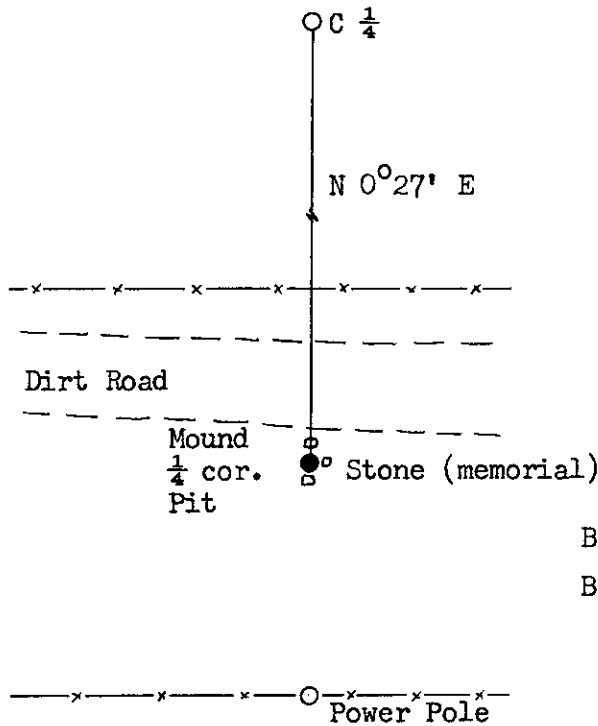

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

1. Set standard U.S. 2" galv. iron pipe with brass cap for corner.
2. Dug pit, 2' x 2' x 1' deep, 2.5 feet south of corner.
3. Raised earth mound, 3' x 3' x 1' high, 2.5 feet north of corner.
4. Left granite stone as memorial.


