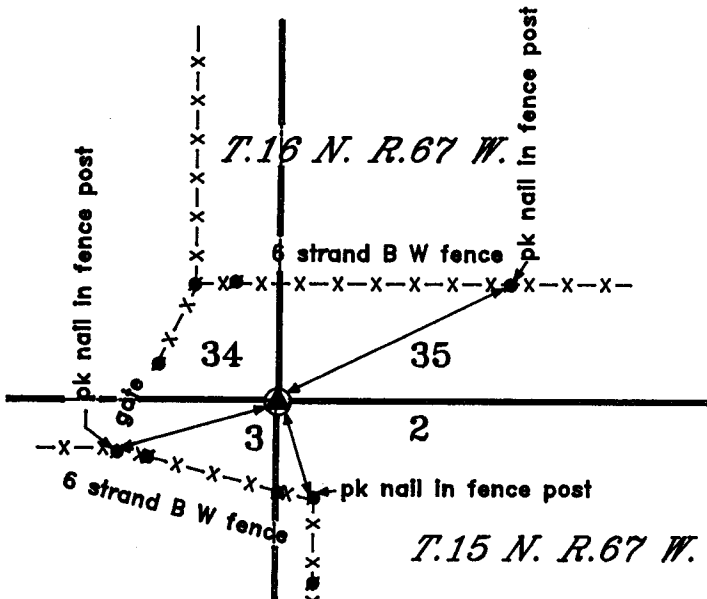

The Method and Rationale used for the reestablishment of lost and obliterated corner.

G.L.O.: Under Contract to Edwin James in the Summer of 1870, Township Boundary Survey. "South boundary of T.16 N. R.67 W. chain length of Township line to be Six miles & 103 links & My falling to be 6 links South of the Township corner. The correction for the true line will therefore be 103 links East & one link North per mile". "West on a true line along the South boundary of section 35 Township 16 North Range 67 West (Variation 16.09'E), 40.00 chains set a limestone 15"X12"X6" for 1/4 section corner; 80.00 chains set a limestone 26"X12"X5" for section corner 34 & 35".

Found a Conglomerate Stone situate, known and being the Section corner according to the Land Owner. The Land Owner stated that his Father and Grand Father both showed him that stone and did declare that that was the original section corner as established by the G.L.O. survey. This Stone is situate in the middle of a trail road and was buried flush with the surface of said road. Replacing this stone with a metal monument that would be certainly destroyed appears th be an effort in futility, so a 1"X2" ALNICO magnet encased in a plastic enclosure was deposited beneath said stone as a memorial, enclosed in the plastic container is a card with the Section, Township and Range written thereon. The ties to this stone as found are shown below.

NOTE: The G.L.O. calls for limestone in this area of Laramie County generally are found to be "Conglomerate" stones.
